She is a member of the Board of the Brussels-Area Node of the Millennium Project and director of publication of the French version of the "State of the Future" 2005 and 2006. She is a member of the French-Speaking Women Council of Belgium, of the NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee, of the Women's Major Group "Creating a just & sustainable future" and of the Front féministe international.

In 2007, Marie-Anne Delahaut has created the foresight research process Millennia2015 "Women actors of development for the global challenges". With foresight as a method and the information society as context in solidarity, henceforth implemented by the **Millennia2025 Women and Innovation Foundation** since 2012.
